NEW 25Mb Package!

Effective May 1, 2019, Monitor Telecom will be offering a 25Mb Broadband package which will replace the 10Mb and 20Mb Broadband packages.

The Federal Communication Commission (FCC) has defined a standard minimum Broadband service at 25Mbps/3Mbps. Monitor Telecom has changed its lowest Broadband package to 25Mb. This means that the 10Mb and 20Mb Broadband packages will be discontinued. Monitor customers with 10Mb and 20Mb have been notified by mail and will be automatically upgraded to 25Mb.

What does more Broadband speed mean? The "megabits per second", often abbreviated as Mb, Mbits p/s or Mbps, are tiny units of data with a megabit representing a million of them. The higher the number, the faster an online activity should be; downloads complete quicker, webpages load faster, movie/music and games run and display without waiting! Broadband Devices that Offer Big Benefits

Wouldn't it be nice to have a personal assistant who listens to your requests, anticipates your every need, available anytime, day or night, and able to give answers to things on your mind? What is a smart speaker?

You can request it to play your favorite music or playlist, set a timer for baking, check the traffic before going on a trip, as well as, control other smart home devices. Turn lights on and off, control HVAC systems, vacuum the house, schedule appointments and reminders, create shopping lists, ask questions on subjects that interest you, get up-to-date weather and news, and the list goes on – all without lifting a finger. And yes, you can play a variety of games, and hear funny jokes!

Users and Benefits

Smart speakers offer big benefits for many age groups. By just using their voice, people with limited movement, physical disabilities, and visual impairment can control their environment, set alarms, control lights, listen to music and audible books, and make purchases. For seniors who are not tech-savvy or may not own a computer, can now access as much information as one could look up on any internet-connected computer; check the latest stock quotes, or ask the assistant to prompt you to take medication at the correct time. Students doing their homework can ask for language translations, math equations, geography facts, get help on spelling, and answer questions on many subjects. Homeowners can connect a smart speaker to a smart home security device than enable a command to "arm my home security system". Or save money by controlling home heating/cooling systems.
