2017 FRS Youth Tour — A Once in a Life-Time Opportunity!

Essay's due by 4pm, March 24, 2017

The FRS Youth Tour is one of the highlights in Monitor Cooperative Telephone's year, as one local high school student is given a unique opportunity to tour our Nation's Capital. 2799 Hosted by the Foundation for Rural Services, students from across the country come together to get an inside perspective of the telecommunications industry, receiving educational sessions on "The World of Telecommunications" and "Looking Into the Legislative and Governmental Process". The agenda also includes touring the Smithsonian Museums, War Memorials, U.S. Capital, Library of Congress, U.S. Supreme Court, Mount Vernon, and national monuments.

This event is available to students who are immediate family members of an active Monitor Cooperative Telephone member, living in the 634 prefix. Students must be high school age 16 or 17 years at the time of the Youth Tour (June 3 – June 7, 2017). Understanding Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi is simply an alternative to network cables, as a way to connect devices of a local area network.

Wi-Fi allows devices to connect to one another the same way as when network cables are used – just without the actual cables. It uses radio frequencies (2.4GHZ and 5GHz) similar to cordless phones. Much like those phones, Wi-Fi has a limited range. This means the further you are from the Wi-Fi router, the slower the speed will be. 2181

The number of devices you have connected to a Wi-Fi router also makes a difference. Wi-Fi has limited radio frequency spectrum ("bandwidth"). Because of this, too many devices trying to use it at once can cause a traffic jam, leading to slower speed. Wi-Fi is just one way to bring internet to a device.

You may avoid the service interruptions or physical injury that could happen if you hit electrical, gas, cable, television, or other service lines. There could be fines and repair costs.
