The Monitor Telecom 2022 College Scholarship of \$2,000, has been awarded to Henry Schmitz, son of Barbara Buchholz. Henry will be

attending Montana State University this fall, where he plans to major in Agriculture Business, along with a minor in the engineering field. He would like to use his bachelor's degree to achieve his long-term goal to run his family's farm and fabrication business.

Growing up on a farm in the Willamette Valley, Henry had many jobs starting at an early age, from hoeing, and cleaning equipment, to swathing fall cabbage and pickling onion seeds. He learned about the responsibilities of farm operations; from management to maintenance and irrigation to seed harvest. He was entrusted to manage the family's 350-acre farm last summer, while his dad was away. This showed his ability to be accountable, dedicated, and capable to oversee such a huge undertaking. Henry relates, "This hard work has taught me many things, but above all it has made me the person I am today."

Throughout his high school career, Henry participated in a variety of sports and academic activities, namely, track and field, cross country, trap shooting, and was a SHS ASB representative. He was also a member of the FFA (Future Farmers of America), and competed in District, State and National FFA Ag Mechanics competitions; his team placed first in State in 2021, and he won the National FFA Ag Mechanics bronze medal in the same year.

What Are Capital Credit Allocation Notices?

Monitor Telecom is a cooperative that is owned by the members. This means members receive a share in its earnings, called Capital Credits.

Capital Credits are based on member patronage, or the amount of money paid for phone and Internet services during the year. It is then credited in the names of the members on the cooperative books. An allocation notice is generated annually for the previous fiscal year (Jan - Dec), and it is mailed to each member who had service. It is at the Board of Directors discretion of when that equity can be paid back to the members.

Monitor Telecom will be mailing out allocation notices for the year 2021. We recommend that you keep your allocation notice with your legal documents. (example notice shown) Contact the business office at 503-634-2266 or email customerservice@monitorcoop.net of any address changes, should you disconnect service, move, in the event of the death of a member or if you did not receive your allocation notice.

Preventing Identity Theft

Identity theft is the act of deliberately obtaining and using another person's identifying information to commit fraud. This may include a persons' name, date of birth, social security number, driver's license number, bank account or credit card numbers, tax or medical records, PINs, electronic signatures, passwords, or any other personal information.

Potential Victims

Anyone can experience identity theft, however children and seniors are vulnerable. Many may not know immediately that their identity has been stolen or go undetected for many years as with Child ID theft.

Warning Signs!!

- Receiving bills for items you didn't buy
- Calls from debt collectors for accounts you didn't open
- Denials for loan applications

Prevention Tips

- Don't share personal information (birthdate, Social Security number, bank account)
- Never carry your Social Security card in your purse or wallet
- Collect mail daily and put mail on hold when on vacation with the Post Office
- Review your credit card and bank account statements for unauthorized transactions
- Shred receipts, statements, expired credit cards
- Install firewalls, anti-virus software on home computers
- Protect information on social media
- Freeze your credit files with Equifax, Experian, Innovis, TransUnion, and the National Consumer Telecommunications and Utilities Exchange for free. Credit freezes prevent someone from applying for and getting approval for a credit account or utility services in your name: Equifax call 800-349-9960 or Equifax.com; Experian call 888-397-3742 or Experian.com; TransUnion call 888-909-8872 or Transunion.com

Take Action

Being a victim to identity theft can seem overwhelming, but the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) can help you report identity theft and give you a step by step recover plan. Visit the FTC website at www.ldentityTheft.gov.

FUSC Increase

The Federal Universal Service Charge (FUSC) increased from 23.8% to 33.0% effective July 1, 2022. This is a federally mandated fee from the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and is designed to keep local phone service rates affordable to all Americans regardless of where they live. This is a pass-through fee.

RSPF Decrease

The Residential Service Protection Fund (RSPF) decreased from \$0.09 to \$0.03. This is an Oregon Public Utility Commission (OPUC) surcharge and is a pass-through fee.
