### Power Outages

Winter storms and power outages seem to go hand-in-hand. Snow, wind, and ice can bring everything to a halt. And a sudden loss of electricity can quickly change your outlook if it's not quickly restored. You may become concerned about heat, food spoiling in the refrigerator/freezer, medical devices, water supply/well pumps, cooking food, charging cell phones, lighting, and landline/Internet access.

#### Landline and Internet Access

As you may already know, Monitor Telecom's fiber optics and router need power to run. Although the ONT (Optical Network Terminal) on the side of your house does have an 8 hour battery backup for landline and Internet access, the router does not. However, once the battery has been depleted, you will need an alternative power source.

#### Be Prepared and Plan Ahead

Being proactive and planning ahead can lessen the stress when home power outages occur. Have an emergency preparedness kit, backup generator, and a strategy plan for longer power outages. Extreme weather events also have a greater impact on older adults, especially if they are living alone, have a disability or are home bound.

# Avoid Breaking Fiber Optics and Repair Fees!

Are you planning on doing some exterior home improvements this year? Perhaps a fresh coat of paint, vinyl siding or trimming those bushes by the house.

If your project requires the fiber optics equipment to be removed, please call Monitor Telecom technicians at 503-634-2266. They will safely remove and re-attach the fiber boxes from your home at the start and completion of your home project. This will ensure that your service will not be compromised.

PLEASE DO NOT remove the equipment yourself nor by your contractor. Fiber optics are very sensitive and prone to breaking. Failure to contact us will result in repair fees for labor and/or materials if the fiber breaks and outage occurs.

- submit completed official Monitor Telephone scholarship application by 4pm, March 15, 2024

Selection shall be made by a committee appointed by the Company, and applications are modified to remove names for a "blind" selection process. # Affordable Connectivity Program Helping Households Connect

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a Federal Communications Commission program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service. This new benefit provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands.

#### TWO STEPS TO ENROLL

- 1. Go to AffordableConnectivity.gov to submit an application or print a mail-in app
- 2. Contact Monitor Telecom to select an eligible plan, and complete an ACP consent form

Eligible households can enroll directly with the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) online at http://acpbenefit.org/. Learn more about the benefit, including eligibility and enrollment information, by visiting www.fcc.gov/ACP, or by calling 1-877-384-2575.

### Oregon 988 Coordinated Crisis Services Tax

Effective January 1, 2024, a \$0.40 monthly tax rate increase per subscriber line of telecommunications or Voice Over Internet Protocol service will be applied to your bill. This is a pass-through fee and is collected by the Oregon Department of Revenue. The tax helps to support the 988 suicide prevention and behavioral health crisis system.

#### **Late Fees**

Effective January 1, 2024, the late fee on past due balances will increase from 2.2% to 2.3%. This fee is charged against any unpaid balances remaining at the time of the next billing cycle.

### **Deposit Interest Rate**

Effective January 1, 2024, the annual interest rate for customer deposits will increase from 4.5% to 5.5%.

### **Notary Service**

Monitor Telecon offers free notary service at the business office. We recommend calling ahead to ensure a notary is available.
